Developments in Technology

During the February holiday the HSV made the transition to a Google Learning Environment and we are starting to use the COOL Learning platform. Last year, several members of staff attended a Google summit here in The Netherlands and came back very enthused. Google is particularly useful because we have staff working across locations and this gives us greater ease to technology. Staff have piloted different elements and now we are working with a whole range of applications. We will provide you with regular updates. We are also currently working on developing a new web site which will have a parent portal. Much is happening with the children in the classroom. We are really looking at our ICT curriculum and ways to develop it. Computer coding is a new part of the curriculum and is currently being piloted in some of the classrooms. We are making major investment in this area in regards to both hardware and professional development of our staff. We are really pleased that @HSV are going to support us in this area. GMR representative needed


School foundations such as the HSV, which are responsible for more than one school, have the legal obligation to set up a GMR (joint parent teacher association). The group communicates with the Board and Management team and discusses policy for schools in our Foundation. The issues discussed deal specifically with matters that affect the whole of the organisation such as the budget, the annual report, school policies and personnel issues.

Spring Breakfast



We ask all parents to contribute a small amount of food. Please aim to cater for 6 children. Finger food is best e.g. healthy muffins, croissants, small rolls and fillings. Please do not send in cereals and milk as this often gets messy. The school will provide the drinks. Your child's class teacher will be in touch with further information.

SPOTLIGHT ON ID 5

Time has flown in ID5 over the past month, with lots of fun and fascinating learning taking place. Coming back from the half-term break, the children helped create a fun and interactive assembly about 'random acts of kindness'. The children decided on a number of things they would do for this - including: offering free hugs, giving out compliments and sweets, putting nice cards and notes in people's bags secretly, and saying thank you to people for all the help they have given.

In curriculum time the children have been busy too. Our IPC topic this term is 'Going Global' and is looking at the globalization of our world. As an entry point the children created their own countries and flags before being given a list of exports that their country could sell to other countries, and the imports they needed. Through playing the children began to see how different countries have economic advantages over other countries, and understood more how international trade worked. From this starting point, they have also created country profiles, using ICT, showing the commodities and value of imports & exports for their home and host countries.





In Numeracy we have been working through the concepts of fractions and percentages, learning how to calculate and use them in different ways. As the children have become more fluent we have been looking at how to improve our reasoning and problem solving and applying our learning in different ways. These concepts have been linked to decimals, which we have been learning about earlier in the year, and the children were able to recognize and organise equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages.





SPOTLIGHT ON ID 5

In Literacy we have been continuing with the story of 'Cosmic', about a boy and his friend (who pretends to be his daughter) who win a competition to be able to travel to space. The children have been arguing persuasively about which 'father' should go to space with the children, and other issues. They have also been developing their ability to justify and explain their opinions over moral matters (such as admitting the truth or hiding it).





Finally, over the past couple of weeks, the children have linked up with the ID1 children to help them create pieces of artwork based on famous artists. Teaming up in pairs or trios, the ID5 children did a wonderful job of supporting and guiding the ID1 children with the task, and the results can be seen on display on the first floor of the school. It was very lovely to see the care and understanding that the children showed, and how supportive they were to the younger children.
