

In 1986, The International Department began with one location, eventually expanding to three locations. At the start of the 2018-19 school year, our fourth location will open (known as VHS). Each school's name is an acronym of their much longer Dutch street name.

The HSV also offers an international early years programme through the Three Little Ships Preschool. Lighthouse Special Education provides education for children with complex additional needs. Both schools will transfer to the new VHS building for the beginning of the 2018-19 school year. This will provide a more inclusive environment for these children and provide additional learning support expertise to the International Department. Families who have children with both special educational needs and typically developing children will have the opportunity for their children to attend school in the same building.

Our small locations in the centre of the Hague gives the schools a real sense of community. Our children may come from all over the world, but they each feel at home at the HSV.



Since 1986, the HSV International Primary School has provided primary-aged children with exceptional educational experiences. Generations of HSV pupils have enjoyed and thrived on the wonderfully diverse opportunities on offer at our school; opportunities that we always have and always will offer within the commitment to developing the whole child to become internationally-minded leaders. This is what we mean when we speak of 'global citizenship, lifelong learning'.

We seek out quality teachers from around the world to nurture our children to become socially responsible members of society. In doing so, we help them to uncover talents, interests and values that not only prepare them for the next stage of their education, but which stay with them for life.

Our children come from diverse backgrounds with a rich tapestry of educational experiences, cultures, traditions and religions. It is our aim that teachers and pupils share and learn about these from each other. We reflect not only upon our differences but also our similarities. Global Citizenship, lifelong learning





Since 2008, the Lighthouse Special Education School has provided a safe and structured learning environment for children with complex special educational needs.

The school is unique in The Netherlands as the only international Special Primary School in The Netherlands offering education in English.

We offer individualised education to children aged 3-13 who are unable to cope in mainstream international education. There are currently two classes: the younger class is for children aged 5 to 8 years old and the older class is for children aged 8 to 13 years old. Each class has a maximum of 8 children in it and is staffed by a teacher and a teaching assistant.

In addition to the school classes, there is an inclusive preschool class called Three Little Ships which offers an early intervention programme for children aged 2.5 to 5 years old.

The children come from international families that are temporarily based in The Netherlands, generally due to the parents' employment. The children have a range of different mother tongue languages but everyone learns to speak English at school.

The staff of the Lighthouse school all have extensive experience of working with children with complex learning challenges and most also have specialist qualifications. In addition to the classroom staff, there are also support staff – a secretary and concierge – and a group of volunteers who support the children at lunchtime.

Many of the children require additional therapies from other experts and currently speech and language therapy, physiotherapy, sensory integration therapy and occupational therapy are given to students during the school day by English-speaking internationally qualified therapists.



### **PROFILE**

The Hague is the capital of the province of South Holland, is the official city of the government and home to the Royal family. 

## **Entrance Criteria**

For The Three Little Ships International Preschool, HSV International Primary School and Lighthouse Special Education, admission requirements stipulate that children must be:

- either of non-Dutch nationality with parents working temporarily in the Netherlands;
- of Dutch nationality, returning to the Netherlands having already received international education in English for at least two years and need to continue their education in English;
- or of Dutch nationality, expecting to leave the country within two years, where the child will attend an international or English speaking establishment.

## THREE LITTLE SHIPS PRESCHOOL

- Children from age 3 4
- Caters to typically developing children and children with additional needs
- As an official childcare organisation, parents have the possibility to receive a refund from the tax department for the costs of the child care (see website for more information).
- Small class sizes of maximum 16 children
- High staff-to-student ratio, with three qualified Early Years professionals working in the class
- Curriculum is play-based, designed to stimulate children to learn skills that are crucial for daily life

## HSV INTERNATIONAL PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Children from age 4 12
- Subsided by the Dutch Ministry of Education, ensuring school fees are competitive
- Small class sizes of maximum 20 children
- International Primary Curriculum (IPC), integrated with the British UK Framework of the National Literacy Strategy and National Numeracy Strategy
- Specialist teaching in gym, music and handicraft
- Dutch language and culture lessons
- EAL for children who require extra support in English language acquisition

## LIGHTHOUSE SPECIAL EDUCATION

- Children from age 4 13
- Small class sizes of maximum 8 children
- Highly qualified teaching staff with experience working with children with complex learning challenges
- A team of internationally qualified therapists available privately. Sessions generally take place at school
- An Individual Educational Plan (IEP) is designed for each student, based on his/her specific educational and emotional needs
- Depending on the child's needs, integration programmes with the HSV International Primary School may be a possibility

# After School & Holiday Care Providers

The HSV works with a number of After School Care providers, known as 'BSO' in Dutch. Most facilities offer childcare from the end of the day until 18:00. In the school holidays and study days, care is offered from around 08:30 until 18:00. The children are collected from school either by bus or on foot at the end of the day. Parents contact these organisations independently and make their own arrangements.

Working parents are eligible to receive a monthly childcare benefit from the Dutch Benefits Office of the Tax and Customs Administration. The amount is calculated based on the combined income and number of hours worked per month.
